Additional drawings were presented for information only in relation to the application for The Lilacs, School Lane, Burghfield relating to the height of the proposed chimney having been reduced.

Details relating to the proposal by Belgrave Homes for development of the Springwood Engineering site in Bunces Lane were presented for information. Members were advised that a planning application is imminent.

WBC forwarded details relating to the withdrawal of 14/02791/MINMAJ for Moores Farm, Pingewood.

iii) <u>To consider any changes in Planning legislation and its impact upon</u> <u>Burghfield</u>

No further items required discussion.

iv) <u>To consideration any implications of a Neighbourhood Plan within</u> <u>Burghfield parish</u>

Mortimer Neighbourhood Planning group are to be encouraged to attend the next committee meeting to answer any questions and concerns the committee have in relation to the progression of a neighbourhood plan. A representative from Bramley Neighbourhood group is also to be asked to attend

#### <u>Transport</u>

i) <u>To consider any Highway or Road Safety improvements for</u> <u>implementation within the parish</u>

There were no items requiring discussion or future action. Comments have been received from local residents regarding the level of parking near to the junction of School Lane and Clayhill Road. A request for the situation to be reviewed once the double yellow lines have been installed was presented.

Members raised concern regarding the increase in overgrown hedges and garden foliage within the parish. Specific houses are to be identified with a formal request for its clearance being requested from WBC.

ii) <u>To receive details relating to the consultation on M4 Junctions 3 to</u> <u>12 Smart Motorway Variable Mandatory Speed Limits</u> A consultation has been launched by the Highways Agency for junctions 3 to 12 of the M4 to have variable mandatory speed limits introduced. Views are being sought until 22nd February 2015.

#### iii) <u>To note the observations made with regard to commercial deliveries</u> being made to Tesco's from the roadside and consider any action

Correspondence from a local resident was received regarding Tesco stores, Hollybush Lane, accepting kerbside deliveries, being in contravention of its condition imposed when planning permission was granted. Photographic evidence is to be requested to ensure WBC are fully aware of the issue. The parish council is to apply pressure on WBC for the enforcement to be activated.

iv) <u>To receive a report regarding the Community Speed watch</u> <u>campaign and determine future locations for deployment</u>

Following liaison with the local police and WBC regarding specific roads, suggested dates and locations, the community Speedwatch scheme was initiated on Reading Road by the Bakery, Theale Road by St. Mary's Primary School and Reading Road at the junction of Hermits Hill. The scheme proved very successful with further dates being suggested throughout January and February 2015.

The following locations were suggested for the 2<sup>nd</sup> round:

Reading Road (just after the Hatch public house), Reading Road (just past Methodist Church), Hermits Hill, Theale Road (by St. Mary's primary school), Reading Bakery (outside Bakery), Clayhill Road (just prior to Hawksworth Road).

## 6. <u>Green issues</u>

i) <u>To give consideration to any green issues within the parish requiring</u> <u>action</u>

The community committee are to be asked to review the possibility of LED light bulbs within the village hall.

The PV panels are scheduled for installation week commencing 13<sup>th</sup> April 2015. An Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) is currently being sought for the village hall to determine the exact feed in tariff.

## 8. <u>Street Lighting</u>

i) <u>To progress the provision of alternative energy saving street lighting</u> within Burghfield and consider any action points for the progression of the project

Following resolution at full council, an order has been placed for the 3 LED street lights for initial installation in Goodwood Close. Consultation with the immediate residents of Goodwood Close will be undertaken after an initial three month period with the remaining 27 lights within the parish to be replaced on a 5 year rolling programme.
