2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Committee

The minutes of the last meeting of the Planning Committee held on 28 January and the draft minutes from the 11 February having been circulated, were confirmed a correct record and signed by the presiding Chairman.

3. Matters Arising on the Minutes

- Comments regarding the application for Mans Hill were resubmitted to ensure their inclusion within the decision making process.
- ii) The request from the Burghfield Scouts to become involved in the "Clean for the Queen" project was presented at full council where members resolved to request the road signs within the parish to be cleaned. The scouts have been advised of the suggestion.

Members were advised of the High Court Judgement regarding Firlands as having been dismissed.

 To give consideration to any potential impact within Burghfield following the release of the second phase of WBC Budget proposals for 2016/2017

Members present discussed the second phase of budget cuts being proposed by WBC for the upcoming new financial year. **Resolved** unanimously to submit the concerns raised by members present regarding the lack of information having been provided, particularly financially, by WBC regarding the proposed cuts within phase two. Members felt unable to assess the true implications of the proposals both financially and within the community due to the lack of overall information and details from WBC.

Miss M Cresser requested the details regarding the subsidy being provided by WBC for bus service 75, being proposed for withdrawal by WBC in the second phase of the budget cuts.

6. Neighbourhood Plan

 To give consideration to the potential development of a Neighbourhood Development Plan for Burghfield

Consideration was given by members present as to the merit in producing a Neighbourhood Plan for Burghfield. The various advantages and disadvantages were discussed at length by those present to determine the recommendation for presentation to full council.

Members present resolved by a majority vote to present the following

recommendation to full council for their consideration:

"The Infrastructure committee presents a recommendation to the parish council that they instigate the production of a Neighbourhood Development plan as soon as possible for implementation". Proposed by Mr D Godding, seconded by Mr D Godwin and resolved by a majority vote.

And application for residential and mixed use development comprising: 203 residential units, convention centre and ice rink, 246 bedroom hotel and up to 102 serviced apartments, decked car parking within convention centre, flexible ancillary retail space, multi storey car park, public open space, associated access, landscaping, cycle parking, transport interchange and related infrastructure/engineering works, ancillary facilities, access and demolition of existing indoor training facility and enhancement of RFC Garden of Remembrance.
