Members were advised of the various appeals being submitted for Burghfield Sailing Club. The hearing has been set for 13th May 2019 at the Rugby Club, Moks Lane, Newbury for 10 days.

Members were advised of the proposal by EE to replace the existing mobile mast of 16m high Mono pole to a 20m antennae, with associated fencing, at junction 12 Motorway service station.

Rob Dance Planning forwarded corresponded with the parish council in relation to the application submitted for Moores Farm.

The NDP group advised that they are awaiting comments from the parish council in relation to the questionnaire for distribution to all households. The questionnaire is to be re-presented at the May full council meeting for approval.

Members gave consideration to S106 projects previously identified, determining the projects are to continue to be pursued with WBC.

7. Transport

ii) To receive an update following the recent deployment of the SID within the parish

The data following the deployment of the SID within in the parish has been received. The data is being formulated in to a readable format for display on the parish website.

Mr D Godwin advised his licencnes for the operation of the SID has been reissued, now been valid until 2022.

iii) To receive the project notification programme from WBC for 2019/2020

Members present acknowledged the schemes included within the WBC programme for financial year 2019/2020 within the locality.

8. <u>Safer Communities</u>

i) Policing & Anti-social behaviour issues

Mr P Lawrence advised of his attendance at a meeting with WBC, the new Police Inspector, Sovereign housing, surrounding parish councils and the District councillors to discuss the increase in serious crime within the area. A long term plan to address the issues, and a reminder to residents as to the recommended process when reporting with crime, is to be developed. A note is to be included within the enext newsletter advising residents accordingly.

Crime has been noted as having increased, specifically car crime, within the locality. Residents are reminded to remain vigilant. More detailed community engeement is to be requested

9. Parish Maintenance Issues

i) To receive a report highlighting maintenance carried out during the previous month

The parish handyman continues to undertake all identified works within the parish, specifically fence repairs and general maintenance. Grass cutting has commenced within the parish.

ii) Footpaths & Bridleways within the parish

A request was presented for a dog litter bin to be installed on the footpath between Theale Road and Sulhamstead Road. WBC are to be asked to inlcude the additional bin on their weekly collection schedule.

The vegetation on the footpath at St.Mary's has been cut back accordingly by the parish handyman.

iii) Grit bins

A full assessment of all grit bins has been undertaken with 3 requiring full replacement. Upon delivery of the bins, the approved contractor will ensure all bins are re-filled ready for later in the season.
